Introduction

A High Green would typically propose or want to see:

- a clearly defined context in terms of complexity, pace, etc.;
- an explanation of the relationship between this document and others.

Roles and responsibilities

A High Green would typically propose or want to see:

- comprehensive descriptions focusing on activities and clearly defined responsibilities;
- clear definitions of communication and escalation channels.

Information management

A High Green would typically propose or want to see:

- comprehensive and robust documentation, with a system that effectively manages information flows;
- a broad range of fields to ensure sufficient information is gathered to encourage informed decisions;
- a well-defined procedure that is effective and efficient.



Assurance

A High Green would typically propose or want to see:

- comprehensive criteria by which assurance will be carried out;
- high standards of compliance and performance.

Budget

A High Green would typically propose or want to see:

- a safe level of resources deployed to the management procedure;
- evidence and analysis to support detailed and comprehensive estimates.

Interfaces

A High Green would typically propose or want to see:

- a robust mapping and cross-referencing with other documents / processes.
